NHS: What YOU told us

In our previous Lib Dem FOCUS (pictured, right) we gave you the opportunity to tell us your experiences of the problems affecting the NHS under Tory austerity.

HOSPITAL SERVICES and AMBULANCE WAITING TIMES

Residents waited on average 4 hrs 1 min to be seen in A&E, and on average 31 weeks for an operation

Happily, too few respondents had needed an ambulance recently to calculate an average time, but some who did had bad experiences...

- "... My 93-year-old Mum waited four and a half hours on the floor for an ambulance, and then spent seven hours on a trolley, mostly in a corridor, at Southampton General before being assessed."
- "...I work in the NHS and waiting times are significantly increasing
- "...Couldn't get an ambulance and had to be driven in by a friend of the family."
- "... A 90-year-old neighbour had a fall and had to wait five hours for an ambulance."
- "... Arrived at GP for 4pm appointment, got to QAH about 6pm, bed available at 1am."



GP WAITING TIMES

Four out of 10 residents wait more than 15 minutes on the phone to book a GP appointment. Nine out of 10 said waiting times to be seen are getting longer

- "...Trying to get an appointment is extremely difficult and can be left waiting on the phone for up to 40 minutes."
- "... I call first thing at 8am as my children are poorly and I am 29th on the waiting line, then I get through and all appointments are gone. So frustrating."
- ... Six out of 10 residents said they usually had to wait over a week for a GP appointment.



appointment with my GP in late Dec/early Jan. Phoned surgery four times (over four weeks), but appointments had all gone each time so I gave up."

"... No regular annual/biannual health checks happening any more (e.g. blood pressure, medication checks, varicose



©DENTIST WAITING TIMES

Five out of 10 residents say they have to pay a private dentist as they cannot access an NHS dentist. Six out of 10 say they have to wait a week or more for an appointment

"NHS dentists don't exist any more."

"No NHS dentists in this area are taking new clients."

"Frequently cannot get

appointments regularly - need to call emergency"

"NHS dentistry is not fit for purpose. Private is only way to receive treatment."

Lib Dems win big in local elections

May 2023 saw the Liberal Democrats' best result in decades. Across England, Liberal Democrats gained an extra 407 councillors. Lib Dems gained majority control of 12 councils and tightened control in all 17 councils we were defending.

Rishi Sunak is running scared of a General Election, because he knows the Liberal Democrats are set to take swathes of Tory seats. Tory infighting over Boris Johnson's refusal to admit his faults makes it even clearer. - It is time for a change.

Success all around us

PORTSMOUTH: Lib Dems gained a seat from the Tories and saw off a Labour challenge. With 18 seats to the Tories eight and Labour's seven, Lib Dems continue to run the city with the help of a few independents.

WINCHESTER: Lib Dems won 13 of the 16 seats being contested this year, including our near neighbours in Whiteley and now hold 30 of the 45 seats on the Council. **EASTLEIGH** Lib Dems have controlled the Council for many years and now hold 34 out of 39 seats on the Borough Council. Lib Dem controlled Eastleigh Borough Council was named Council of the Year in 2022.

In **EAST HAMPSHIRE** Lib Dems made sweeping gains, particularly in Petersfield, and in **HAVANT** we regained a presence on the Council with victories in Hayling Island and Bedhampton.

A27 Delme roundabout to Downend Road Works

Preliminary work has been carried out before the main works start on the A27 Cams Hill Improvement Scheme which is part of the Transforming Cities Fund Programme.

Hampshire County Council has appointed Mildren Construction Ltd to carry out the highway works.

The scheme includes:

- The provision of a bus and lane bus priority signals on the eastern arm of the Delme Roundabout.
- The provision of a two-way segregated walking and cycle track next to the westbound carriageway.

- Improvements to the payments to the south, next to the westbound carriageway, with a shared-use path for pedestrians and cyclists to the south of the segregated cycle track.
 - The conversion of the existing crossing at the Cams Hall Estate junction to a Toucan crossing.

Lib Dems call for 'Glyphosate Free' vision for Fareham



In June a petition in excess of 1,500 signatures calling for Glyphosate not to be used in public places triggered a full council debate. Glyphosate is a pesticide used by Fareham Council to kill weeds.

The UK government has said Glyphosate is safe, but some Councils have gone 'Glyphosate free' and many other countries have conditions minimising its use in public spaces.

"Glyphosate will kill plants other than weeds. It threatens bees and makes dogs sick. I believe we should aim to one day be Glyphosate free. I specifically called for us to keep a watching brief on new 'Glyphosate Free' products coming onto the market and stop its use in children's play areas. We can use alternatives like strimming for those small areas to keep them tidy."
